Graduate Profile Academic Year 2017



Report Highlights

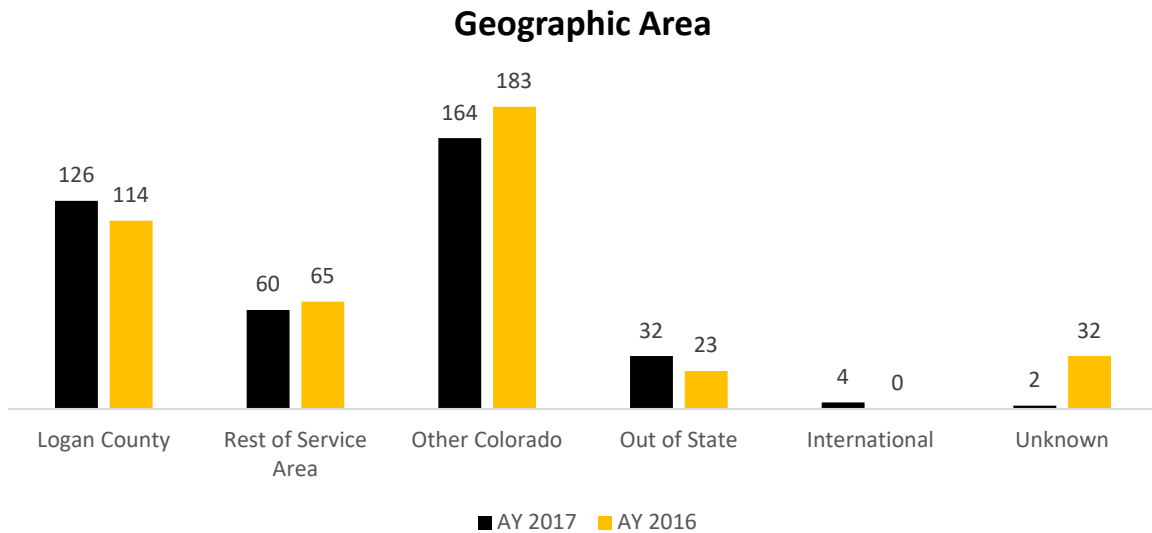
- 388 completers that earned 674 awards for AY 2017.
- 108 completers began taking courses at NJC while in high school.
- 182 completers were female; 206 completers were male.
- 62 completers were athletes at NJC who earned 88 awards.
- 186 (47.9%) were from NJC service area; 80 of those were HOPE Scholarship recipients.
- 115 completers had a GPA of 3.5 or above.

Completers refers to the number of students who have completed an award between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017.

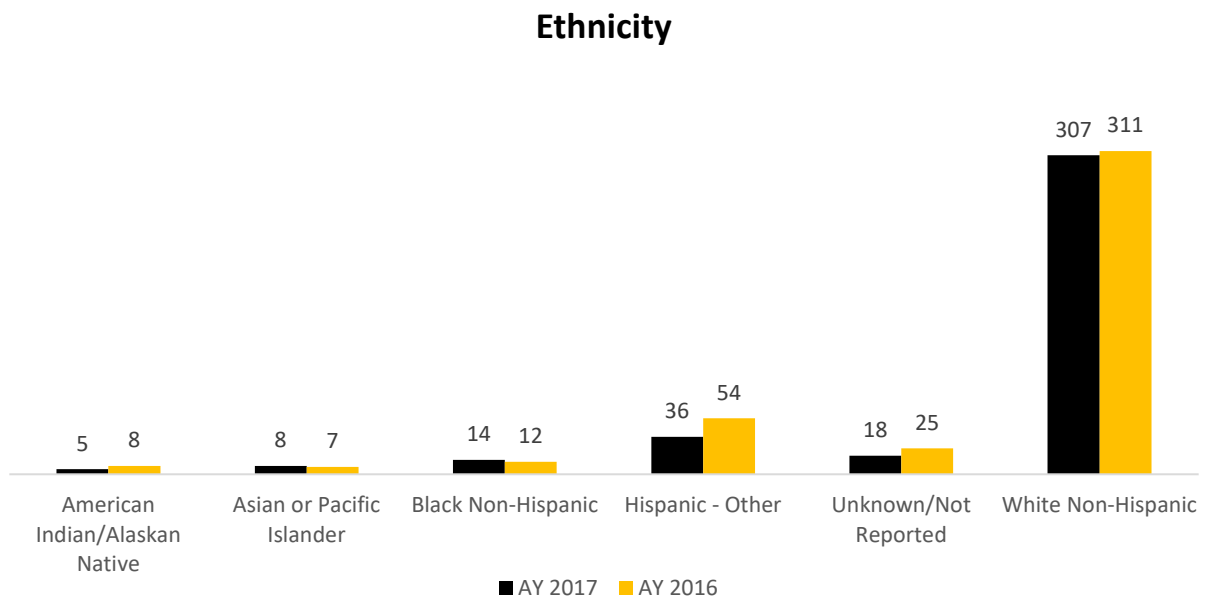
Graduation data was extracted from Cognos ODS August 2017. The data in this report matches the official SURDS (student unit records data system) FY 2017 Degrees Granted report filed August 2017 with the Colorado Department of Higher Education. CDHE then uses this data for official reporting purposes.

Data related to individual student numbers is unduplicated; while data related to degrees and certificates is duplicated as a student can earn more than one degree or certificate.

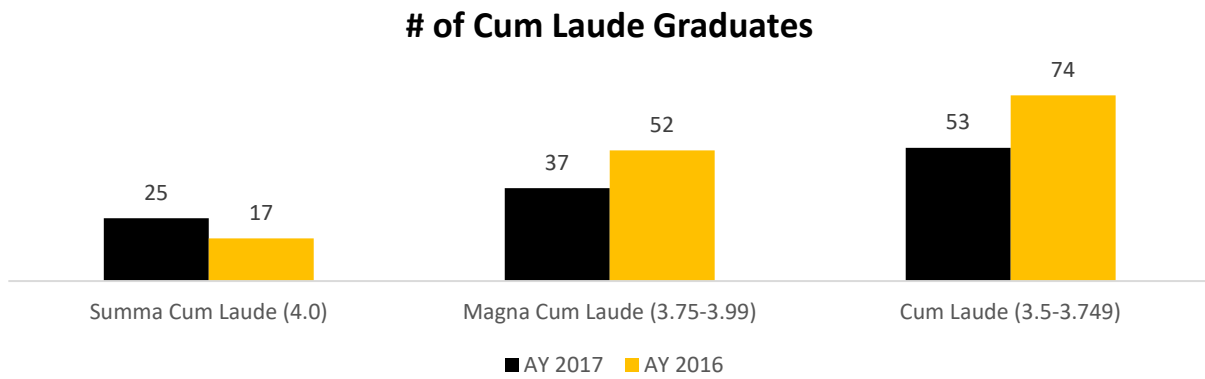
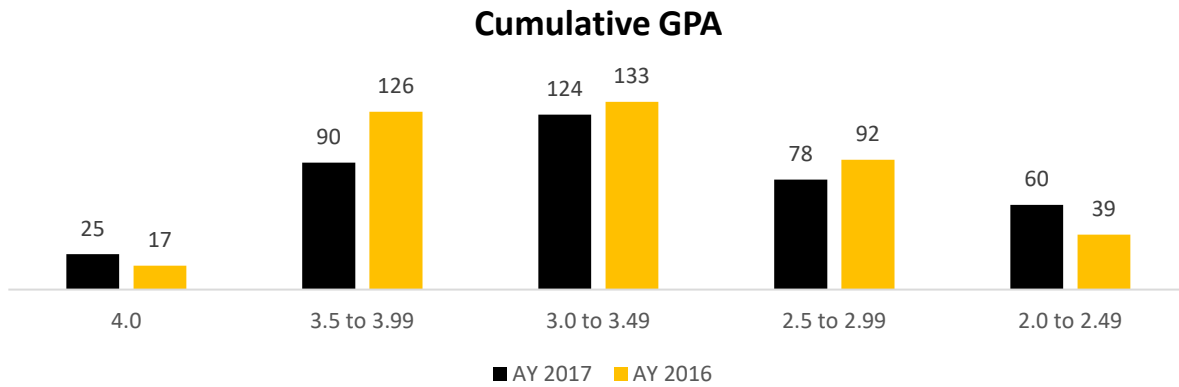
There were 388 students that earned 674 awards for AY 2017 which consists of Summer 2016, Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 graduates. This compares to 417 students earning 790 awards for the previous academic year. The following chart shows the geographic area graduates were from in comparison to AY 2016.



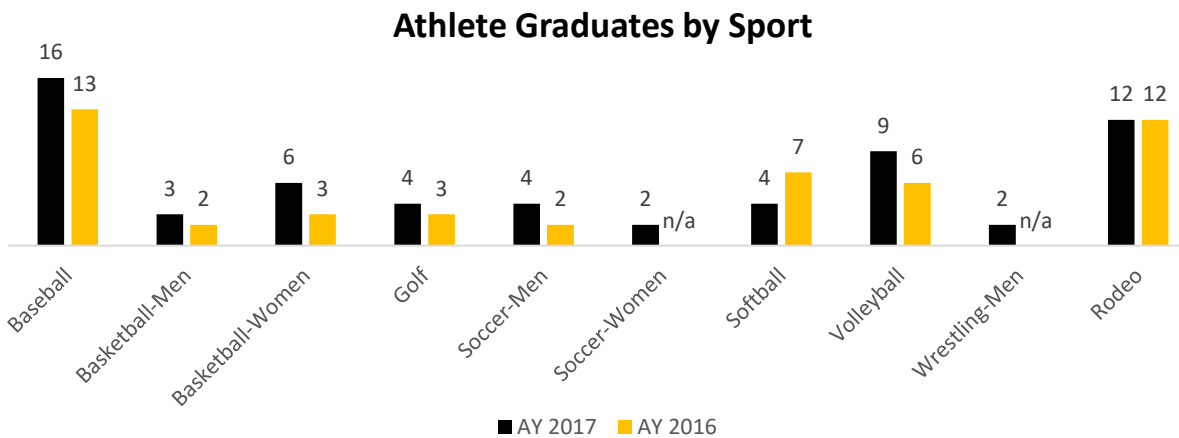
The next chart shows the ethnicity breakdown of all graduates compared to AY 16.



Cumulative GPA and the number of Cum Laude graduates are shown below.

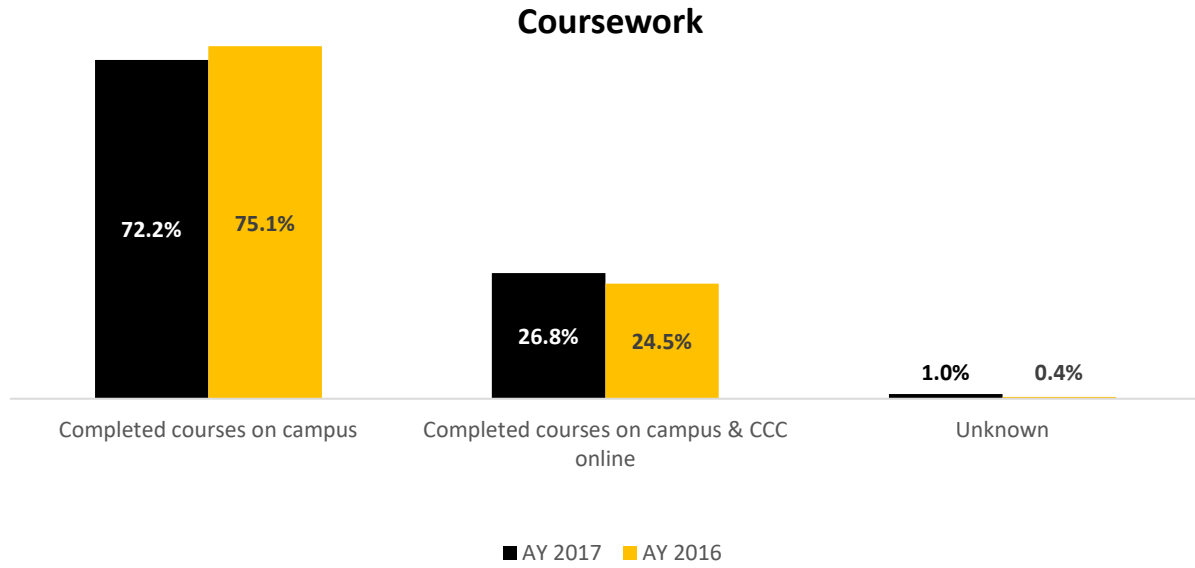


For academic year 2017, there were 62 student athletes that earned a total of 88 awards. The average GPA for academic year 2017 student athletes was 2.99 compared to 3.30 for academic year 2016.



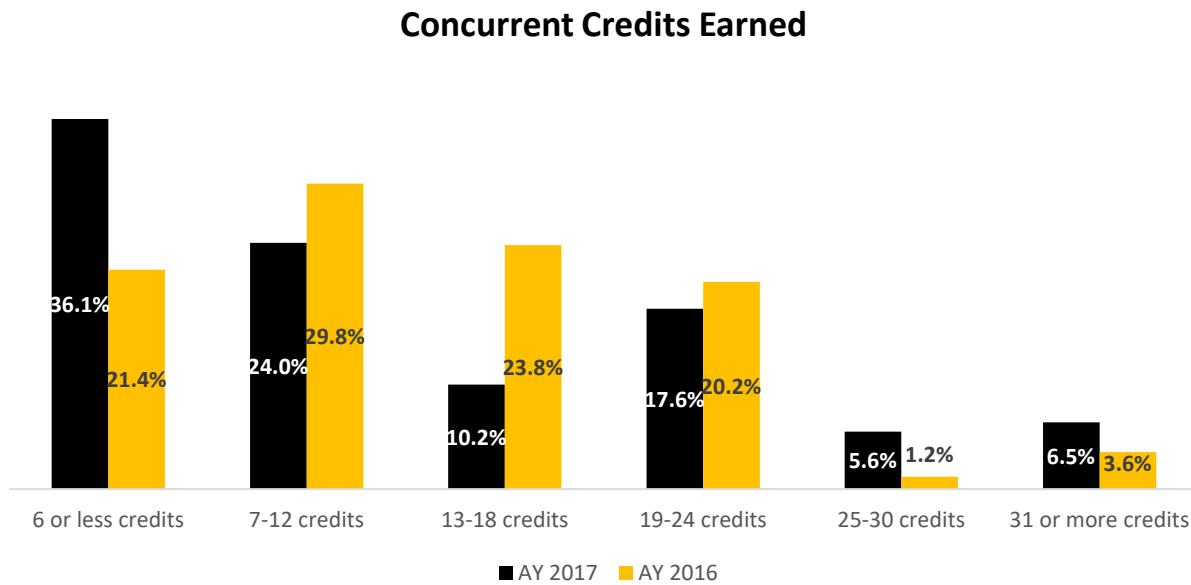
Soccer-Women and Wrestling-Men were not offered at NJC prior to Fall 2016.

72.2% of students completed coursework on the NJC campus for AY 2017. This is down from 75.1% for AY 2016; 26.8% of students completed coursework on campus and online in AY 2017 compared to 24.5% for AY 2016.



Unknown percentages are the result of not finding student course data due to the length of time students have been attending NJC.

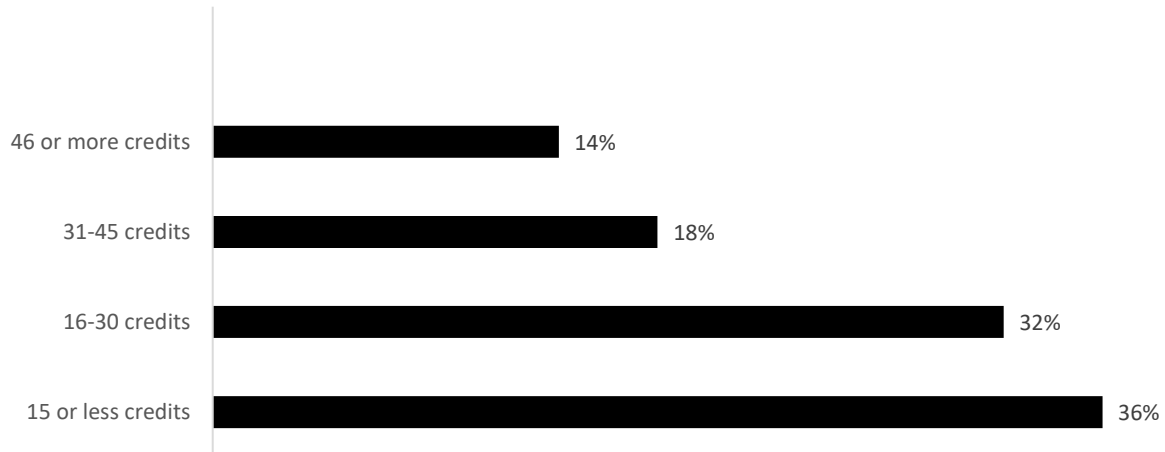
Of the 388 completers for AY 2017, 108 completed courses at NJC while in high school. 36.1% completed six or less credits and 24% completed between seven and 12 credits.



Two students were found to have completed a degree while still attending high school for AY 2017.

A new data element that has been added to the graduate profile for AY 2017 looks at how many credits transfer students accumulated at other colleges that were accepted at NJC.

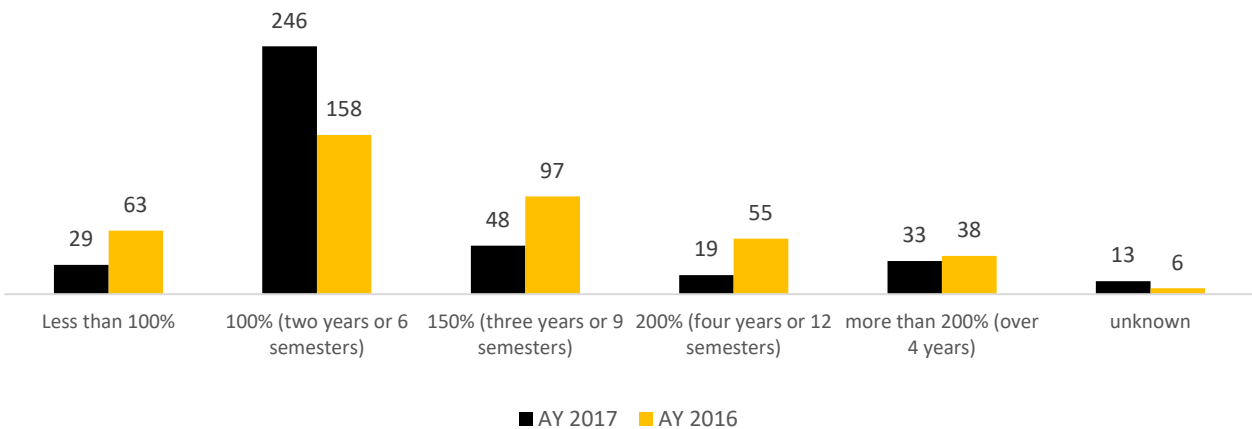
Transfer Credits Accepted

Some CTE programs have various certificates embedded in the degree; so students earn those as they complete the program. For example: automotive has nine certificates, diesel has eight; business has four and wind has three.

Of the 388 completers for AY 2017, 63 or 16.2% are considered minority ethnicity; this compares to 19.4% for AY 2016. The following chart shows the 109 degrees earned by minority completers for AY 2017.

This transfer data specifically looked at NJC graduates during AY 2017 only and the student counted as a transfer only if they were enrolled at a 4-year university in Spring and/or Fall 2017. Students enrolled in community colleges and enrolled only for summer terms were not counted.

As of August 2017, a total of 90 NJC graduates have enrolled in 4-year universities in Colorado and other states across the country. National Student Clearinghouse data contains information regarding a students' major at the transfer institution. Some of the majors listed are as follows: Mechanical Engineering, Animal Science, Agriculture Business, Nursing, Finance, Business Administration, Biological Sciences, Criminology, History, Elementary Education, Neuroscience, and Pre-Law to name just a few.
