

AGRICULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIPS

Carl Fonte Foundation

Awarded to a student(s) majoring in general agriculture or agricultural science with emphasis in conservation and/or natural resources.

Brickel Brothers Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1999 through the generosity of the Charles D. Brickel Estate. Mr. Brickel was a life-long farmer in Logan County. Two scholarships are awarded annually, one to an incoming freshman and one to a sophomore. Applicants must be agriculture majors. Recipients will be selected by the NJC Ag Scholarship Committee.

Colorado Flatlanders Car Club Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1992 for freshman and sophomore vocational students interested in the field of auto tech. The scholarship provides two scholarships to freshman or returning sophomore students in the auto tech program. Selection is made by the Colorado Flatlanders Car Club Scholarship Committee on the basis of character, need, scholastic interest and participation in school affairs. Sophomore applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75. Sophomores must submit a college transcript, letter of resume stating vocational motivation and specific aspects of financial need to the Colorado Flatlanders Car Club, PO Box 248, Sterling, CO 80751 by May 1.

Jeffrey Grauberger Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1994 in memory of Jeffrey Grauberger, one scholarship for the sophomore year only.

Applicants must be Logan County residents carrying a 3.0 grade point average or above. Recipients will be chosen by an NJC Ag/Tech faculty member, and a Young Farmers member.

Schreiber was an agriculture major and a member of the 1998 NJC Championship Livestock Judging Team. This scholarship is awarded annually to a sophomore student who is majoring in Agriculture. Applicants must include one letter of recommendation from an instructor, professor or advisor and must provide an essay on his/her future goals in Agriculture and how this scholarship will assist him/her in attaining these goals. The student must have maintained a 3.0 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) upon graduation from high school and during his/her freshman year of college. Selection is made by the Ag Scholarship Committee.

Qualified applicants must have a minimum 3.5 GPA, and application materials must clearly document the student's leadership, integrity, strong moral character, and community involvement with letters of reference and/or other supplementary materials. Qualified applicants must have a minimum 3.5 GPA, and application materials must clearly document the student's leadership, integrity, strong moral character, and community involvement with letters of reference and/or other supplementary materials. Previous involvement in 4-H and FFA activities considered positively. Selection is made by the Ag/Tech Scholarship Committee.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Alpha Delta Kappa Scholarship

Nu Chapter of Alpha Delta Kappa offers a scholarship to a freshman or sophomore who plans to teach. The award is payable in two equal amounts. Xi Alpha Zeta Scholarship

Xi Alpha Zeta, Exemplar Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, offers a scholarship each year to a student for use in the sophomore year at Northeastern Junior College. This scholarship was established in 1975. The recipient is chosen by a committee of Xi Alpha Zeta members on the basis of character and motivation, as attested to by a letter from an instructor of Northeastern Junior College (required), scholastic achievement, and need. Documentation of need, however, is not required. The recipient must hold a college grade point average of at least 2.00.

GRADUATE AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS

Commencement Award

Names of winners of graduation awards are announced at Commencement each year. The Charles F. Poole Award goes to the person who leads the class scholastically, has attended Northeastern Junior College continuously, and has contributed to campus activities. The Armilda W. Dowis Vocational Award goes to the outstanding graduate in occupational program.

Colorado State University College of Business Scholarship

NJC students admitted directly to CSU College of Business are eligible to receive a \$500 per year (renewable for up to six semesters) scholarship. To renew, student must carry at least 12 hours per semester and earn a 3.0.

APPLICATION: Submit a written essay about your academic/career goals and why you deserve the award. Send essay and transcript to NJC Business Division.

The Bruce Gill Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1994, the Bruce Gill Memorial Scholarship is presented to an NJC graduate displaying scholarship and leadership abilities and planning to transfer to Colorado State University. The award carries a nonrenewable \$500 cash stipend to be used for the junior year at CSU.

The Griffin Foundation

Scholarships are roughly equivalent to the cost of full-time resident tuition, books and fees, room and board for qualified applicants with an Associates Degree or at least sixty academic hours transferring to Colorado State University, University of Northern Colorado or University of Wyoming. Applicants must have cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, leadership and service, personal traits and financial need.

Elsie Minnie Good Memorial Scholarship

Open to any NJC graduating Logan County resident with a 3.0 GPA, transferring to a four-year college within the state of Colorado. A \$1500 per year award will be awarded at the rate of \$750 per semester (renewable for the second year). Application requires a cover letter, two letters of recommendation and NJC transcript.

Tom L. Porter Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to an NJC sophomore with acceptance and transferring to CSU.

Applicant must be from Washington County, Colorado.
