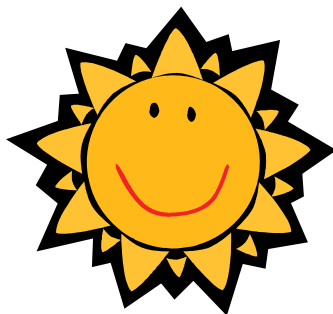

Needs, Wants and Money

The lessons in this two day class explore some of the basic economic concepts. During day 1, students will learn about needs, wants, scarcity and opportunity costs. Activities will include identifying needs and wants, an activity looking at scheduling and sacrifice and students will be able to participate in an auction to look at scarcity. Day 2 will examine the difference between money and bartering. Students will first try to barter to get the ingredients to make a snack and then later money will be introduced to help in the exchange of goods. The day will end with students making a snack to enjoy the completion of the class. Instructor is Andy Long.

Budgeting and Day to Day Living

Day 2 will take the lessons learned from the simulation and put it into real life. Students will research different careers to look at different income levels. 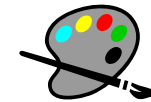

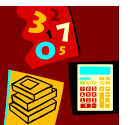
